Required documents for APB Authorisations in marine sites

Background:

- The authorisation process for marine based farms under the under the Aquatic Animal Health Regulations (England & Wales) 2009 requires that Habitat Regulation Assessments (HRA) under the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations (as amended) 2017 are conducted where appropriate.
- Prospective Aquatic Production Businesses (APB's) that fall within a Special Area of Conservation (SAC), Special Protection Areas (SPAs) and / or RAMSAR sites will require an HRA.
- An HRA is an evidence-based assessment of the implications of any new plan or project capable of affecting the designated interest features of a European Marine Site (made up of SAC/SPA). A HRA is a process starting with a Test of Likely Significant Effect (TLSE) which is designed to assess whether the proposed activity will have an impact on the designated habitat and species features of an SPA/SAC. If a potential impact is identified, then an Appropriate Assessment (AA) is carried out to provide more detail and mitigation measures. These two processes make up an HRA.
- In most cases the FHI will undertake the HRA required, however, in order to start the authorisation process, you will have to provide evidence that you have the correct permissions or consents to use the site you are applying for authorisation for.

Please provide all of the following that apply to your authorisation:

1. Evidence of the right to occupy all land forming part of the authorisation.
2. A valid planning consent, or an official notification from the relevant local authority planning department that planning consent is not required.
3. If the proposed farm is within a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) either an official consent, or a notification that a consent is not required must be provided by Natural England.
4. In the case of marine sites a Marine Licence, or an official notification of exemption (in the case of certain shellfish farms) must be obtained from the Marine Management Organisation.
5. The Crown Estate (CE) own much of the foreshore in England and Wales, and where the farm is situated in an area owned by the CE, evidence of a seabed lease needs to be provided.

Once the required documents have been sent to the FHI along with your fully completed AW1 application form, we will begin to process your authorisation application.
