Blue Marine is delighted to offer this opportunity to graduates who are invited to join our mission to protect 30% of the ocean by 2030.

We recognise the importance of ensuring graduates and the generation who will be front runners in the next decades are equipped with the necessary skills as we seek to restore health to the ocean.

This is an annual, dedicated two-year training programme for graduates to join the charity each September.

About Blue Marine

Blue Marine is a UK ocean conservation charity set up in 2010 by some of the team behind the award winning documentary film 'The End of the Line'. Blue Marine aims to restore the ocean to health by addressing overfishing, one of the world's biggest environmental problems.

The charity is dedicated to creating marine reserves, restoring vital habitats and establishing models of sustainable fishing. Its mission is to see at least 30 per cent of the ocean under effective protection by 2030 and the rest responsibly managed.

About The Scheme



You will work alongside colleagues to complete four rotational placements over a period of two years.

This will give you core experience in the following:

Education ((6 months))

- Working to inspiring all ages to become ocean advocates, with engaging materials and hands on education and training programmes.

- Learning how to fundraise in an effective and informed way to support the charity's vital work.

- Working with our policy team to learn how to engage with policymakers to implement stated policy and to alter policy to deliver sustainable fishing and marine protection. .
